#### **God Talk**

Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the Lord under Eli. The word of the Lord was rare in those days; visions were not widespread...the Lord came and stood there, calling as before, "Samuel! Samuel!" And Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening." --1 Samuel 3




"The word of the Lord was rare in those days," yet God chose to speak to a lowly apprentice in the temple. Samuel had no idea what he was getting into at the time; he didn't even realize it was God calling him at first. He ran to the temple priest, Eli, thinking that was the voice he heard, but it turns out it was not Eli but God who was calling him, God who had chosen him. He finally answers God and says he's ready to listen and do whatever it is God needs of him.

This story is commonly told as a *call story*, the story of God calling Samuel to a particular task in the history of Israel. I love that aspect of the story, and I also like to note that opening line: The word of the Lord was rare in those days. Sometimes we think about the stories in the Bible happening at a time when people spoke directly to God all the time, like Abraham walking with God on the beach or Moses being told to go talk to Pharaoh. But this line reminds

us that that was not always true. Sometimes the word of the Lord was rare. Sometimes God felt distant or silent, so much so that Samuel had no idea what was happening when God called his name.

And yet, God continues to show up in unexpected places. When God's word is rare it doesn't mean that God is absent from the people. God may be present or calling in ways we do not recognize in the moment. Sometimes we need someone like Eli to point out for us that God is calling so that we know how to answer. God may be calling us to do something, like Samuel, or just calling us to listen and know that God is with us. May we all find God's word in unexpected places.



#### Center for Veteran Issues

The Center for Veterans Issues, Ltd. was born out of longstanding frustration with a range of negative factors confronting veterans returning from the Vietnam War. After many years of trying to work through a number of efforts and institutions, the Center was founded as a way of providing a consistent, professional, effective, and replicable means of moving beyond the advocacy and addressing problems harming low-income veterans and their families. Below are just a few of the services & programs:

Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) can make living a little less stressful when falling into hard times or financial strain. The focus of the program is to promote housing stability among very low-income Veteran families who reside in or are transitioning to permanent housing.

Homeless Veterans Reintegration Program (HVRP) provides a full array of employment training services along with wrap around supportive services to Veterans re-entering the labor force.

The Heroes Market Program is designed to help address food insecurities that our Veterans and their families are experiencing.

Join us – and invite your friends and family, too – as we work *together* to fundraise \$165K for grants to central city congregations in the Greater Milwaukee Synod!


