


Reformation and Confirmation Sunday

God Talk

This month, we will be engaging in an intentional period of reflection on stewardship at St. Paul's. But what does stewardship mean, if not just money? We are good at noticing God's presence and expressing our gratitude, but how do we stew-



ard the gifts God gives? This fall, St. Paul's is exploring the theme of "growing in grace" each Sunday, as we read excerpts from *Seedfolks* and consider the ways we can tend the gifts of grace within ourselves and others, like a well-watered garden. I think stewardship has something to do with that idea; being a steward of God's gifts means noticing and recognizing those gifts within ourselves and the world around us so that we can say "thank you" and then care for God's gifts in ways that tend them and help them to flourish.


One of the ways I have experienced stewardship in my ministry over the past year has been through the process of shepherding Lucy and Lena Micheel through confirmation. Through weekly conversations and sporadic activities, I have been given the opportunity to notice God's gifts of creativity, wisdom, and insight within Lucy and Lena, as well as our theological tradition. Helping our confirmands develop their own theological critical thinking lenses has been an

experience of meaningful stewardship in my ministry. As they take the final steps toward celebrating confirmation this month, Lucy and Lena's experiences of Lutheran theology and their personal faith journeys are growing and flourishing.

As we embark on a month of stewardship, I hope you might take some time to notice how you are involved in the process of tending God's gifts within and around you. Stewardship is rooted in sharing and tending God's gracious gifts, and I can't wait to hear more about how we are doing that in our congregational community.



As we continue to invest in our future as a congregation, a committed group of St. Paul's folks has been meeting to get a capital campaign rolling. Look for more information as





Penfield Children's Center - MKE

Penfield Children's Center helps children reach age-appropriate milestones, enter school ready

to learn and overcome developmental challenges. Our professional and caring staff include speech pathologists, physical and occupational therapists, special education teachers, nurses and certified nursing assistants, social workers, and early education and child care professionals.

This month highlights the Behavior Clinic:

The Behavior Clinic at Penfield Children's Center provides treatment services to children 5 years of age and younger who have behavior and emotional challenges. A partnership between Penfield and Marquette University, the Behavior Clinic is the only program of its kind in Milwaukee offering family-centered, inhome treatment sessions that address issues very early in a child's development to help prevent serious mental health issues from developing in the future. For many young children under the age of six, behavior issues are overlooked or parents are told their children will "grow out of it." While some challenging behaviors are typical during the toddler and preschool years, others can indicate a more serious condition.


