

God Talk

In Matthew 9:37, Jesus tells his friends, "The harvest is plenty, but the laborers are few."

As with most of scripture, there are lots of different angles one could take in inter-



preting this passage. But as we prepare to celebrate our country's harvest holiday, Thanksgiving, in a few weeks, this text came to my mind and caused me to wonder what it could mean for us.

All throughout scripture, Jesus talks with his friends and followers about the kingdom of God coming to life on earth using all sorts of metaphors to illustrate what that might be like. As I read these words from Jesus about a harvest, I wondered if he might be talking about a harvest of good things, kingdom things—a harvest of hope and grace among us now. When Jesus describes a plentiful harvest, ripe for the gathering, I think he's talking about all the good things God is bringing to life and fruition on earth. And I think he's calling his friends (and us) to join him in the work of noticing and "harvesting" those good things, so that the

plentiful goodness of God can get to the people and places that need it.



"What is Two-Spirit?"

November is National Native American Heritage Month, and as we learn and celebrate native his-



tory, we also have an opportunity to deepen our understanding of an LGBTQIA+ native term called "Two spirit."

"Traditionally, Native American two-spirit people were male, female, and sometimes intersexed individuals who combined activities of both men and women with traits unique to their status as two-spirit people. In most tribes, they were considered neither men nor women; they occupied a distinct, alternative gender status. In tribes where two-spirit males and females were referred to with the same term, this status amounted to a third gender. In other cases, two-spirit females were referred to with a distinct term and, therefore, constituted a fourth gender."

Board of Parish Education—two-year term




