





God Talk

"I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now." -Philippians 1:3-5



Five Finger Prayer

1 Your thumb is nearest you. So begin your prayers by praying for those closest to you. They are the easiest to remember. To pray for our loved ones is, as C.S. Lewis said, a "sweet duty."



2 The next finger is the pointing finger. Pray for those who teach, instruct and heal. This included teachers, doctors and ministers. They need support and wisdom in pointing others in the right direction. Keep them in your prayers.

3 The next finger is the tallest finger. It reminds us of our leaders. Pray for the president, prime minister, leaders in business and industry, and administrators. These people shape our nation and guide public opinion. They need God's guidance.

4 The fourth finger is our ring finger. Surprising to many is the fact that this is our weakest finger, as any piano teacher will testify. It should remind us to pray for those who are weak, in trouble or in pain. They need your prayers day and night. You cannot pray enough for them.

5 And lastly comes our little finger – the smallest finger of all which is where we should place ourselves in relation to God and others. As the bible says, 'The lease shall be the greatest among you.' Your pinkie should remind you to pray for yourself. By the time you have prayed for the other four groups, your own needs will be put into proper perspective and you will be able to pray for yourself more effectively.

This month, we will celebrate Valentine's Day—a holiday all about romantic love! So, what could be better than an opportunity to give thanks for





Look Who's 80!

Did you ever notice the numbers next to the month and year of each edition of the Messenger? For those of you playing along at home, the "Vol." stands for the volume or the number of years the publication has been circulated and the "No." stands for the

number of issues that has been published during that year. Last month, our little monthly newsletter known as The Messenger turned 80 years old!

I called upon the first person I could think of to give us some fun facts about the Messenger and a little bit of her years working as its editor: our very own Ethel Walter. Ethel said that it was Pastor E.H. Stoltz who began writing the monthly newsletter all those years ago. "He wrote the articles himself and had it printed at a printer on glossy 11x14 paper that was then folded in half." Ethel said during our conversation. She also mentioned that she was the church secretary for a while and she somehow was transferred into the job of creating, editing and printing the Messenger. Ethel held the editorial job of the Messenger for 13 years!

During that time, Ethel typed up the articles and pages on a typewriter and printed it on a mimeograph machine that was housed in the church office which is now the Resource Room, the small space outside of Pastor's office.

A mimeograph machine was a low-cost duplicating machine that worked by forcing ink through a stencil onto paper. It was popular in the 70's and early 80's before

smaller office printers were affordable. Ethel began adding graphics to the Messenger by actually cutting out pictures and words from the mimeograph company's literature that they sent out and pasting them to the page before mimeographing.

In the early 1990s, when Louisa Hoessel was our church secretary, Louisa was looking for additional working hours and with council approval, the Messenger duties were shifted to the church secretary. During Louisa's 20 years behind the desk, and armed with an office printer, Louisa created the smaller size and look of the yellow covered Messenger you may be holding right now.

As 2024 unfolds, watch for more fun and interesting tidbits from the last 80 years of The Messenger! Until then, let's look at 1944, the first year that the Messenger was published and some fun facts. -Dianne Polinske




